

**Subject Headings and Keywords** to use in searching Catapult, *WorldCat* or the periodical databases. Use terms found in your textbook. Please note that the term “human development” does not really work well—that is because it is not an accepted term used by professional librarians.

Use the Subject Search in Gale or ProQuest for help if you are not finding what you think should be there. Also use the *Library of Congress subject headings* (5 volumes) to determine other useful subject headings. This set is found to the left as you come into the library on the short shelf of the Reference section. The *Sears list of subject headings* is also available. It is on top of the Card Catalog.
